## 5. Topics for Final Research Paper

This course has offered an overview of some of the main themes and issues that eastern Germans have had to come to terms with since the reunification. For your final paper, you will write 12-15 pages that explore one of the thematic areas of this course in greater detail, or investigate another aspect of the GDR experience or the decade and a half since that we did not cover in the course. To write the paper, make use of the "Additional Reading Materials" list on Blackboard, your own class notes, and at least three new, outside sources (from academic journals or books but not the internet). On the following page are some thematic areas we did not cover or covered only very briefly in this course that you might consider for your final paper topic.

Some thematic areas to consider and explore:

- 3. The sports doping scandals after 1989 and what happened to former top athletes
